Getting Ready for Winter

So, what happens to the trains during the winter months?

Basically nothing. Well, almost nothing. The outside G scale is secured for the winter winds and snow and the items on the outside G Scale layout are covered with sheets to protect them. The rest of the club is basically business as usual. We spend time repairing and adding to the layouts as needed. This winter the HO Scale town will be completed and settled in. The HO round house should be installed. O Scale will be repairing broken switch machines and N Scale will be finishing up under track wiring and controls. The track around the O Scale logging mountain will be replaced to allow us to run some of the "older" (1930's and 40's) locomotives. The heat in the building is kept to around 55 degrees to keep all; metal somewhat stable. We will still maintain our second Saturday of the month open house and will run trains during that time. During our Christmas show we discovered an idea; "Some come to find an old memory and some come to create a new one."











Meet Randy Geisick, Building Maker

If you have visited our club, you have seen some of Randy's work. You see, Randy likes to build houses, barns, hospitals, fire stations and other various buildings. These are not your typical buildings. In our tiny world of 1:160, Randy's buildings are made mostly of paper and construction insulating foam. Randy has found and downloaded many of these buildings from the internet, printed them on cardstock, and glued them to foam block. Others are inspired by actual buildings. His first "custom" build was of the hospital where he was born in Greeley, Colorado. Randy found old photos of the hospital online. He printed out pages of N-Scale bricks, windows, and doors and in the end, provided a replica of the hospital. Another fun build was that of Twin Falls new Fire Station #2. This was more of a challenge. Since the building was so new, it required a different approach. Randy took more than 50 photos of the actual building. Using photo editing software, he was able to recreate the exterior of the building and print it out on card stock and donated it to TF Fire Department.

So, who funds the club and who does all the work?

The club is a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization under Idaho law. At the fair we run a 50/50 raffle to raise funds along with the donations dropped in our "donation" boxes. We have also received financial donations from individuals from time to time. Our dues are \$10 per month. In the year 2024 the members have personally donated \$4,553.34 in actual funds or items purchased and donated. In 2023 members donated over \$6,000.00 in funds or items. To date in 2024, members have logged in over 3,600 hours of volunteer time keeping the trains running. This is not only running the trains but doing maintenance on the layouts.
